## Course objective

The course aims to provide an in-depth insight into the craft of research communication, both written and oral, and in various genres based on the doctoral student's own research.

## Course content

- Research communication and research-related debate contributions and conference presentations in various fields and subject traditions
- Completion of debate posts, posts on social media, policy input or teaching text


## Intended learning outcomes

After completing the course, the doctoral student should be able to:

- communicate your own research orally and in writing, in different contexts, media and for different target groups

For a doctoral degree, the doctoral student must show:

## Grade

Examinations included in the course are assessed according to a two-point grading scale with the grades fail or pass (U or G).

Grades must be decided by a teacher specially appointed by the university.
Anyone who has not been approved in the regular exam must be given the opportunity to retake the exam.

## Requirements

To participate in the course and the tests that are included in the course, the applicant must be admitted to graduate level education at Mälardalen University.

## Selection criteria

Doctoral students accepted at other universities in and outside Sweden can be granted access to the course subject to availability, the same applies to teachers with a doctorate at Mälardalen University. Selection of applicants is made in accordance with the ranking below.

4. Teachers holding a doctorate at Mälardalen University
